## SUMMER SHOW 2024

Dear Exhibitors and Friends,

Following the excellent show in 2023 we will once again return to the Pannier Market on Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> August 2024. We have Simon Inch as our opener and being a well-known local councillor and a gardener he needs little introduction. The National Begonia Section Society Show is now a separate section and is open to NBS members only. The NBS Show has the normal selection of classes. Entry fees for any class, except Children's Classes are now 20p per exhibit. Admission to the Show is now £1 with accompanied children free. The prize structure remains much the same as last year but many classes have been amended and some sections removed or reduced. In 2022 we introduced The Norman Heard Memorial Trophy to honor a very long-standing and loved exhibitor who despite his lack of hearing was a great exhibitor and friend.

We were the only Flower Show in the Torrington area in 2023, and we provided the biggest spectacle of exhibits in the area, thanks to the excellent support of the National Begonia Society members throughout the country. Please make as many entries as you can and most importantly, bring all your friends along to the show. Spread the news of our event. Remember you can spend many hours around our Show and the Town as well, so make it a day out. With refreshments in the hall, it really is a splendid way to spend the day. Another great benefit is that there are no parking restrictions around the market on a Sunday, other than on double yellow lines, avoid these please.

Our venue, as in recent years, is the Pannier Market, and remains an excellent venue for the Show. We ask exhibitors to help each other and move their vehicles to a parking spot away from the hall once unloaded. The Honestone Street Car Park is Pay & Display, even on Sundays (check boards for costs) and this has pedestrian access next to the Joiners Arms, giving almost level access to the Market. Much easier for parking and virtually no hill to climb. You will also note that we are closing entries on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> August and that they all come to Mike Avis. You may phone an entry to Mike Avis on 01237 475914, where in case of absence an answer phone will take your entries or you will be redirected to my mobile phone. Postal, delivery by hand or email to [mikeavis44@gmail.com](mailto:mikeavis44@gmail.com) in advance of the closing date are much preferred to ease the task of printing the exhibitors cards. Prize Cards this year are as last year, generated by ourselves and always prove popular. We shall also have cards supplied by The National Begonia Society, for their section. Finally thanks to the judges, exhibitors and visitors who come to us from far and near. The vegetables must be displayed within an area or on a board measuring a maximum of 45 x 60 cm (18 x 24 inches). Each vegetable will be judged against a maximum of 20 points, 7 for size, shape and colour, 7 for condition and 6 for uniformity.

### COOKERY RECIPES

#### BOILED FRUIT CAKE

##### INGREDIENTS

- |                                |                                    |
|--------------------------------|------------------------------------|
| 110g (4oz) Self Raising Flour; | - 110g (4oz) Plain Flour;          |
| 110g (4oz) Margerine           | - 170g (6oz) Sugar;                |
| 330g (12oz) Fruit (Mixed)      | - 1 level tsp Bicarbonate of Soda; |
| 1 level tsp mixed spice        | - 2 beaten eggs;                   |
| A pinch of salt                | - 1 cup of water.                  |

##### METHOD

Put Margerine, Sugar, Fruit, Spices, Bicarb and Water in a saucepan. Bring to the boil and simmer for 1 minute. Leave to cool. When cool add the beaten eggs and flour and salt. Put into a 7" tin and bake at 160°C for 1 hour.

#### LEMON DRIZZLE CAKE

##### INGREDIENTS

- |                                |                                      |
|--------------------------------|--------------------------------------|
| 225g (8 oz) Self-raising Flour | 225g (8oz) Unsalted Butter, softened |
| 225g (8 oz) Caster Sugar       | 4 Eggs                               |
| Juice of 1½ Lemons             | finely grated zest of 1 lemon        |

##### METHOD

Heat oven to 180C/fan 160C/gas 4. Beat together 225g softened unsalted butter and 225g caster sugar until pale and creamy, then add 4 eggs, one at a time, slowly mixing through. Sift in 225g self-raising flour, then add the finely grated zest of 1 lemon and mix until well combined. Line a loaf tin (8 x 21cm) with greaseproof paper, then spoon in the mixture and level the top with a spoon. Bake for 45-50 mins until a thin skewer inserted into the centre of the cake comes out clean. While the cake is cooling in its tin, mix together the juice of 1 ½ lemons and 85g caster sugar to make the drizzle. Prick the warm cake all over with a skewer or fork, then pour over the drizzle – the juice will sink in and the sugar will form a lovely, crisp topping. Leave in the tin until completely cool, then remove.

## **RULES FOR EXHIBITORS**

- 1 The Show will be conducted in accordance with the rules and standards contained in the Royal Horticultural Society's Show Handbook 2008 Edition except where, under this schedule they obviously do not apply.
- 2 All entries now have an entry fee of **20p**, except for Children's and Disabled / Special Needs Sections K & O which are free. For telephone, or email entries payment can be made on collection of entry cards.
- 3 All exhibits must have been grown by the Exhibitor for at least 2 months prior to the Show. This does not apply to Sections H,I,J,K,L,M,N, or O. The Committee reserves the right to inspect the gardens of competitors to satisfy the conditions of this rule and to refuse entry where violation is confirmed.
- 4 Exhibitors may make only one entry per class, except NBS section where two entries per class are permitted.
- 5 A Novice exhibitor for the purposes of this show is one who has not won a trophy in the section in which they wish to enter at any Open Show organised by this Club.
- 6 Exhibits must be staged by the Exhibitor, unless prior arrangement is made with the Secretary. Exhibitors are reminded that exhibits must be staged entirely within the marked spaces for the entry or class.
- 7 Exhibitors must provide their own items for staging, except in classes 20, 21, 64, 80, 81 & 82, and NBS bloom classes, where the boards will be available from the Club if required, exhibitors are encouraged to use their own. Please inform if using own boards. Exhibitors are reminded that all cut flowers, etc., shown in containers must have the stems in water or water retaining material.
- 8 Exhibitors are requested to name their exhibits where possible, to provide added interest to the Show. They are reminded that correct naming will be considered by judges in cases of close competition.
- 9 Exhibits may be staged between the following times:-  
Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> August 7.30 to 9.00 p.m.  
Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> August 7.30 to 10.00 a.m.  
The Hall will be cleared of exhibitors at the end of each staging session and in readiness for judging. Only those involved with stewarding will be allowed to remain.
- 10 After judging has taken place, exhibits may not be altered or removed until the close of the show at 5.00 p.m. without the consent of the Secretary.

## **RULES FOR EXHIBITORS - CONTINUED**

- 11 When exhibits are not of a sufficient standard to merit the award of prizes the judges may withhold a prize to ensure that competition for trophies is fair.
- 12 Where there is a tie for Most Points Trophies, the most First Prizes will be taken into consideration, then the most Second Prizes. Should there still be a tie, the trophy will be shared for an equal period.
- 13 The RHS Banksian Medal will be awarded to the exhibitor with the highest number of points gained in Sections A, B, C, D, E, F & G. No other sections will be eligible for this award, but are eligible for the overall points trophy.
- 14 All trophies are perpetual and must be returned to the Secretary one month prior to the next Show, in a clean condition, or at the request of the Secretary.
- 15 The decision of the judges and committee will be final. In extreme circumstances the ruling of the R.H.S. may be sought by the Committee.
- 16 The committee will take ordinary care of the exhibits but cannot be held responsible for any damage or loss whilst they are in the Hall.
- 17 Prize Money and Special Prizes may be collected from the Treasurer from 4.00 to 5.00 p.m. All prizes remaining unclaimed after the close of the Show will be considered to have been donated to Show expenses unless prior arrangement has been made..
- 18 All entries close 9.00 p.m. Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> August 2024. Late entries will not be accepted.
- 19 All entries must be made on the enclosed form, accompanied by the correct entry fees, with childrens ages stated , and sent to the Secretary Mike Avis, 19 Moreton Avenue Bideford, N.Devon. EX39 3AY. Telephone may be made on Bideford 01237 475914 which has answer phone facility or fax to 01237 471011, email mikeeavis44@gmail.com. Telephone, fax or email entries must be paid for on collection of exhibitor's cards.
- 20 Place cards will be issued to exhibitors on arrival to stage the exhibits. They must place the card supplied beneath the exhibit and have their name face down, so that it cannot be seen by the judge. Failure to do this can result in an exhibit being disqualified.
- 21 Exhibitors are reminded that it is their responsibility to ensure their exhibits conform to the schedule requirements and to collect the exhibits at the end of the show.
