### SECRETARY'S PAGE

### Well Friends,

Let's look forward to the next few months and look back over the period since our last newsletter and the Summer show. We took 19 members to Buckfast Abbey completely free for them but with a charge of £15 for 3 non-members who joined in the trip. We also had minibus invite and visit to the home of Mike & Pauline Wright at Sheepwash for a Cream Tea and chance to see the garden they created from scratch in just 4 years. A remarkable job in view of Mike's health and with over 100 varieties of Hydrangea. The Cream Tea raised money for two charities and was declared by the 13 who visited to be the best scones they'd ever enjoyed. There was even an offer of a BBQ next year too and with their catering experience I can guess what that could be like. Both trips were on a day when the rain held off. We had a very good 57th Flower Show on 10th August brought forward due to the Begonia Society having to move its national show date. This as usual brought exhibitors from throughout the West Country and South Wales plus some returning local exhibitors as well. We were short of several regular exhibitors due to the change of date but entry levels were Ok however there were no childrens entries again and this is a recurring problem. All exhibitors expressed the delight in the fact we are keeping the show alive and indeed next year's date has now been set for Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> August 2026. I tried to look at changing the date to avoid RHS Rosemoor Produce Show but come up against the potential loss of other key exhibitors as we did this year, so we return to the same respective Sunday as before. A big bonus as far as I was concerned was the lack of a Pannier Market on the Saturday, since the Town Council decision to cease holding these for the future. I'm sure not everyone is delighted by that decision but it worked in our favour and I've requested access for 2026 also on the Saturday. In fact there was nothing on after 2pm on the Friday either so a few of us set too and laid out the hall with lovely new tabling plus some 20 of our own tables and trestles which were brought to the hall on the Thursday afternoon. Saturday at 10am we covered the tables and judges David and Elise Cann helped mark it all out. It really is now so easy to be ready for exhibitors to stage by 7.30pm in fact they could start staging from 2.30pm and much appreciated by those from away off-loading their pots of plants. The show was great with excellent quality and let's hope next year will be even better. There were several lapsed members who attended and paid subscriptions. There were 3 new members from the show and others who have recently joined the club too plus an indication that others will come to the next meeting to join.

Following good evening meetings from May to July are now monthly and we have the October meeting which switches to afternoons at 2.30 for the Autumn / Winter Meetings. The consensus of those attending the AGM in March was that on Winter nights folks are not feeling safe to drive on dark nights or indeed to walk to meetings. The result is that with the agreement of the Methodist Church Hall these will now be held the same respective second Tuesday of the month but commencing at 2.30pm and will be in the Choir Room of the Church Hall as it can be made a good deal warmer with small portable heaters although the space is very limited. As we all know the big hall is very cold so the smaller room is better for the size of numbers we are getting. I am

informed that the church is to be sold by auction and bookings after November are not being confirmed until that is organised. We need to now find another venue for our meetings. Preferably on the same Tuesdays and for the Summer months in the evenings as not everyone can attend in the afternoon. It's fine for the October to December meetings but not all year.

Entrance is through the same doors on Honestone Street Car Park. Just a reminder that during the daytime 8.00am to 6.00pm there is a charge for parking. Currently that is £2.40 for 2 hours / £4.00 for up to 4 hours which will cover the meetings duration.

Subscriptions have resumed as of the March AGM at the same rates but some still have not yet renewed to date, If not interested please just say and the costs to the club can be avoided. On a positive note, we were given a grant of £1200 by Bideford Bridge Trust in September and £500 from Bideford Town Council in April. We are extremely grateful for this having as usual, lost money again on the Summer Show this year. We have good funds and intend to use them for members benefits.
